Mayor's summary of the Village

Start July with a Safe Holiday!!! The **4**th **of July Parade** will begin at **10am** for spectators along Corrales Rd from Corrales Elementary School and end at the Rec Center at 500 Jones Road.

The Village of Corrales limits fireworks to only ground and hand-held sparkling devices, cone fountains; crackling devices; cylindrical fountains; flitter sparklers; ground spinners; illuminating torches; and wheels. No cone or fountain can have effects over 10 feet in the air. Fireworks cannot be self-propelled **and** allowable fireworks must be on barren or paved land. Fireworks are **NEVER** allowed in the **Bosque**.

Fire safety -- make sure there's a **good plan** in place for your **livestock** who require extra time and care to get them **evacuated safely** in the event of a fire. Here's a few ways to ensure you can be **ready at a moment's notice** in the event of a fire or other natural disaster.

- **label your horse/mule/livestock**. For a horse, a simple **luggage tag** can be **braided** into the **mane** or shave your phone number into their hair, to include at least owner's name and phone number. Use a sharpie to write your number on their hooves. It should be something that cannot easily be washed off.
- Ensuring your **horse trailer** is functional in **good working condition**, as well as easily accessible.
- Have a **buddy system** in place in the event you don't own a trailer.
- Make a plan for evacuating your animals and some idea of where you'll board them on fairly short notice.

Remember to check with the staff at the **pool or gym** if you need to use either. The **new gym** has gotten very busy; you will need to **go online** to **reserve time.** Pickleball and basketball are especially popular. The **pool** is **limited to 200 people** so check beforehand. The Rec Center staff can be reached at 505-899-8900.

The **Corrales Growers' Market** is Sunday from **9 AM until 12 noon**. The primary focus is on fresh produce grown by local farmers. **Tickets** are being sold at the market to get a **home cooked dinner** for 10 by **Chef Jon Young**, who is the Chef Ambassador for New Mexico Agricultural Department. The drawing will be held on Sept. 8th.

Other news from the Mayor --The Village learned that the funding application to the New Mexico Department of Transportation's MAP program (Municipal Arterial Program) to repave Meadowlark between Corrales Road and Loma Larga was approved. The estimated cost for the project is \$725,000.
