Mayor's comments

Mosquitoes are here!! Sandoval County has stepped up vector control program. Spraying is done in the county and in the Village. We are all concerned about the variety of viruses mosquitoes carry. Spraying continues until mid October or until the weather is no longer conducive to mosquito breeding. If you are concerned about your bee hives, put up a "No Spraying Here" sign. If you do not want spraying done near your property, you can put a sign up. Spraying is not done on private property or private roads by the county. We are hoping to get **PNM** to be more proactive at **cutting limbs** of trees **around power lines.**

The **enforcement officer** with Planning and Zoning, **Sherrie Rice**, will be looking at properties that have **potential fire hazard issues**. She and the fire chief are working hard to **keep us and our properties safe**, not cite or fine you. Their recommendations will help us in the Village **avoid a catastrophic fire** event.

"Etiquette" is needed when we are out an about. Remember, cyclists yield to pedestrians. Pedestrians and cyclists should yield to equestrians. Horses think of themselves as prey and unfamiliar activities can "spook" them.

Corrales Fire department uses the KnoxBox program for both residential and commercial buildings and gates. A KnoxBox or Knox gate controller is a safe and efficient way for the fire department to be able to access your home and property during an emergency. The Knox key to open the box or gate is a key that only Corrales Fire has access to use. If you have an electric gate at your property, you can add a Knox Key opener to allow the fire department to open your gate. If you use a padlock on your gate there are Knox pad locks. The KnoxBox is placed on your home or business with a key to your door locked in the box. Having easy quick access for the fire department during an emergency when you may not be able unlock the door or gate is essential. You can review and order Knox products at www.knoxbox.com.
