The first winter Growers' Market is this Sunday, 1/5/2025, 11 AM until 1 PM. The winter markets will be the first Sunday of the next 4 months, January through April, 11 AM until 1 PM. Check the web site at https://corralesgrowersmarket.com/ for what produce will be available for purchase.

Remember that **Christmas trees** can be recycled starting Monday the 6th at Corrales Public Works, **7 AM until 3 PM**, Monday through Friday, off **Double S Road** behind the post office. Remove all decorations, and no artificial nor flocked trees, please.

This will be an **election year** in the Village. For those who want to be more involved and **run for an office**, start coming to the **council meetings** to see what kinds of things are coming before the council for consideration. The council meets the **second and fourth Tuesday** of the month at **6:30 PM** in the council chambers at **4324 Corrales Road**.
