Mayor's Comments

We are happy to announce that our **new fitness gym** opened on January 21st **in the old gym!** Our new fitness gym offers a variety of workout machines and will start offering group classes soon. Additional small group class times and classes will be added in the near future.

Memberships are also coming soon, but until they are available we are operating on a free trial basis for the fitness gym alone. Come check out our workout facility and get your free trial while it lasts. On the Village web site, go to Parks and Rec, go to Fitness Gym information. Under "Supporting Documents" you can view the memberships that are to come as well as availability times. We also are partnered with Silver Sneakers for those who are looking to use that avenue. Silver Sneakers can be used for either the fitness gym or the recreation gym and are being accepted at this time. There may be some registration required.

In 1978 the Corrales Bosque Preserve was declared a protected area. The village of Corrales oversees the Preserve to maintain it as a Natural Area and Wildlife Preserve. See Corrales Code of Ordinances, Chapter 11 at https://library.municode.com/nm/corrales/codes/code_of_ordinances?nodeld=CH11COBOPR. The boundary of the Preserve begins inside the green gates at roadway entrances. Please familiarize yourself with the terms of use and especially the prohibited activities. Bosque opens between 5 AM and 7 PM November through March, and between 5 AM and 9 PM April to October.

Riparian habitats are particularly important for avian communities in the arid Southwest. As such, the Preserve was designated as an Important Bird Area (IBA) in 2013. Many bird species nest in this area, and the endangered Southwestern Willow Flycatcher and the Western Yellow-billed Cuckoo, a species of conservation concern, have been observed there. The Preserve is also an important stopover habitat for many migrants that pass through on their ways south and north.

There are numerous trails in the Preserve. These trails are not maintained, and you can encounter natural obstacles or impediments. Please do not make new trails for your convenience as this negatively impacts the habitat. Trails can be used by walkers, hikers, horseback riders, and bicyclists. Unauthorized motorized vehicles, including e-bikes and e-boards, are not allowed within the borders of the Bosque Preserve, on the Sandoval Lateral ditch road, levee, or dirt paths. Signs are posted throughout the Preserve that indicate who has the right of way on trails. The rule is that bikers yield to equestrians and walkers/hikers; and walkers/ hikers yield to equestrians. Equestrians have the primary right of way on all Bosque trails. Caution must be taken to avoid frightening a horse as this could cause injury to horse and/or human. When encountering a horse and rider while walking or on a bike, for everyone's safety, you must announce that you are passing, and you should ask the equestrian whether you can proceed – for the safety of you, the horse, and its rider.

Dogs must be on leash and you must pick up your dog's waste and dispose of it properly. The safety of our waterways counts on this! There are doggie waste bag station**s** at several entrances to the preserve.

Learn everything you ever wanted to know about water rights at the **Water Rights 101** Meeting Sponsored by the Corrales Farmers Co-Op, **February 5th from 5:30 to 7:30 PM** in the Council Chambers and on Zoom. The meeting will be recorded and posted to the Village's YouTube Channel. The **Conservation Easements presentation** by the New Mexico Land Conservancy, will take place **February 13th** from 3:30 to 5 PM, also in the Council Chambers and on Zoom.

HEALTH AND SAFETY UPDATE

On Sunday, **February 23 at 2:00 PM** the fire department will be hosting an interactive **Community Emergency Preparedness meeting** on being prepared for All Hazards with an emphasis on wildfire. This will be held at the council chambers and via zoom. You can find the Zoom link on the Village website calendar HERE.

They will also host a public meeting on **Wednesday**, **February 12th from 6:00 pm to 8:00 PM** in the council chambers and on zoom, to get public input on the updated **Community Wildfire Protection Plan**. WHAT DOES A COMMUNITY WILDFIRE PROTECTION PLAN DO?

- · Identify areas at risk for wildland fire
- Make recommendations for hazardous fuels treatments (vegetation thinning)
- · Prioritize areas for wildfire mitigation funding
- Make recommendations to homeowners to reduce fire risk
- Ask the public to share ideas about wildfire prevention and identify community values at risk
