



Mayor's Comments

May 31, 2025

At the May Village Council meeting this past Tuesday, the Farmland Preservation and Agricultural Commission presented five properties for consideration for **agricultural easements**.

The commission found a benefit to purchasing farmland conservation easement on all properties that submitted applications. The assessment of the properties by the commission included a ranked order of importance of preserving these lands as shown below with one being the highest ranked property and five being the lowest ranked property:

- 1. Indigenous Farm Hub/Trosello Property (NACA Inspired Schools Network)– 6 acres
- 2. Holmes Property 1 acre
- 3. John Whitney Property 1 or 2 acres

- 4. Christina Marshall Property 1 acre
- 5. Wildlife Rescue Inc. of NM 2 acre

Several owners spoke at the council meeting and that can be viewed on our You Tube channel (https://youtu.be/LfV-h7ciWb8). All five properties will move on to the next phase in the process to further evaluate the value of each property and working on agreements for the easement purchases.

A message from our **Equestrian Advisory Commission**: All equestrians, please note: When crossing Loma Larga, you should be aware that the recently applied FogSeal on the roadway may cause slippery conditions for your horse/mule. There have been reports of animals losing their footing. We recommend you dismount, put the animal on a loose lead, and then proceed across the roadway on foot before re-mounting. This situation will improve as the Fog Seal dries and cures. We ask that drivers be courteous and cautious when seeing a horse crossing the road, especially now, and give them space to get across safely without pressure.

The **Friends of Corrales Library** will have two fund-raising events next week. On Monday, June 2, Sandia Bar will host a fund raiser from 5 to 8 p.m., with music provided by Midnight Diner. A portion of the proceeds will benefit the library. Be sure to mention the library when you order.

Books, CDs, DVDs, games, and puzzles will be available at bargain prices (generally \$1 or \$2 each). For even better bargains, come on Sunday from 2 to 4 p.m. and fill a bag (bring your own preferred, but we'll have some, too) for just \$5. Again, all proceeds support our wonderful Corrales Community Library's programs and collections. Volunteers are needed to assist with this year's sale.

HEALTH AND SAFETY UPDATE

Measles cases in New Mexico and the United States are still climbing. The best prevention is having two doses of the MMR vaccination. In counties with increased risk of measles exposure, which Sandoval County is considered, the New Mexico Department of Health (NMDOH) has updated MMR recommendations. Infants 6-11 months should receive an early dose of the MMR and then receive two additional doses. One between 12-15 months and another one between 4-6 years old. Anyone born between 1957-1968 who had an inactivated MMR vaccine should be vaccinated now and a second dose at least 28 days later. If you received one dose of attenuated MMR vaccine you need one dose of MMR only. If you were born later than 1968 and only had one MMR vaccination, you need a second one. Pregnant women are NOT recommended to receive an MMR while pregnant, severely immunocompromised persons are NOT recommended to receive an MMR. Healthcare Personnel without presumptive evidence of immunity should receive two doses of MMR with the second dose at least 28 days after the first. If you are unsure if you have been vaccinated, or number of vaccines you've

had, or if you had measles if born before 1957, you can ask your health care provider to run an MMR blood titer. NMDOH has even more useful information on the website at https://www.nmhealth.org/about/erd/ideb/mog/.
