January's history stems from the Roman god Janus, the god of beginnings, giving the month its name and its role as the start of the year. This tradition was started (around 715-673 BCE) by King Numa Pompilius and cemented by Julius Caesar's calendar reform, the [Julian calendar](#), in 45 BCE. It was later formalized on 1582 AD by Pope Gregory XIII with the modern [Gregorian calendar](#), though its official adoption as the new year's start varied across countries. Historically, it marked transitions, like the Roman shift to January 1st for consuls and the Saxon "wolf month." Generally, January is the coldest

month of the year in the Northern Hemisphere. The equivalent month of January in terms of temperature in the Southern Hemisphere is July. Referring back to the Julian and Gregorian calendars, January is the first month of the year and the first of seven months to be 31 days long.

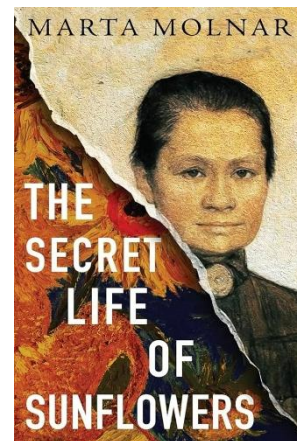
After a scaled back couple of months, the Compadres will be back to normal in January. To learn more, read on.

Sumac spiced chicken with tomato sumac onion salad

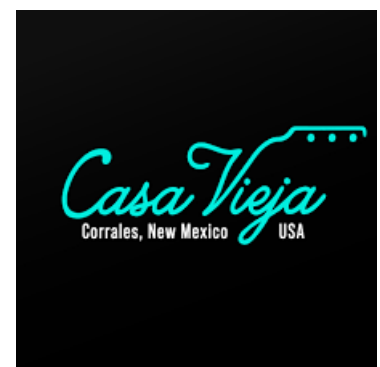
Wednesday, March 18, and Thursday, March 19.

## Mayor's Comments

### December 2025

This will be the last message from me, so **Happy New Year**. Good luck to the new administration coming in on Jan. 1, 2026. The swearing in of the newly elected officials will be Jan. 2, 2026, at 5 p.m. in the council chambers.

The village has just agreed to be fiscal agent for a large grant to deal with dead and down in our stretch of **the Bosque**. We are partnering with the State Forestry Division, which is providing funds, and the MRGCD, which will be doing in-kind work. This will happen later in 2026.

In the meantime, **transmission lines** to deliver **water** to fight fires are being put in along rights of way in the village. You will see more yellow fire hydrants. Soon, we hope to have a 500,000-gallon water tower on the top of Angel Hill.

Progress is being made with **Salce Park planning**. The village has been approved for a grant to fund the project. You can see the presentation about the plans for the park that was given to the council at the Dec. 16, 2025 ,meeting by going to the

The state **legislative session** will begin soon, and we are making priorities for funding known to our representatives. You can view a copy of the brochure we created here: <https://www.corrales-nm.org/villagecouncil/meeting/december-16-2025-regular-council-meeting>,

The village needs to continue to work on the **40-year water plan** required by the state engineer to be in compliance with their requirements and so we can get additional water rights which the village does need for municipal and as a backup for agricultural use.

CFD was able to help make the holidays a little brighter for several families by making sure they had gifts, clothing, and healthy food.
